AMBASSADOR CLIMATE CONFERENCE - 2025


“One Earth, One Future: Youth for Climate Action.”


KINDERGARTEN CAMPUS



 They walk their rounds from day and night.




In this world of chaos, where shadows may grow,

Q: One message for us?




