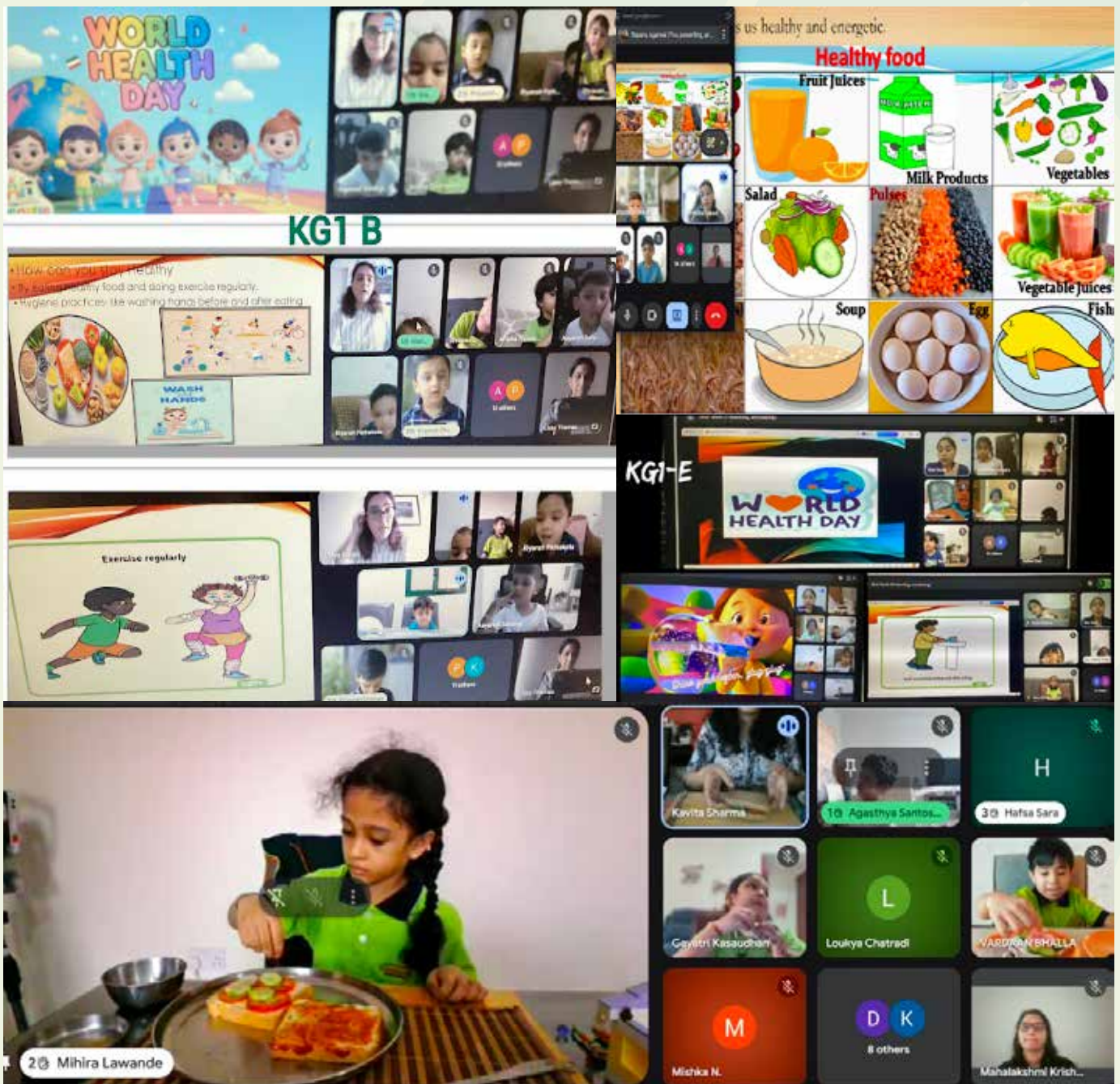

In our online classes, we encouraged our young learners to understand simple ways to take care of their health

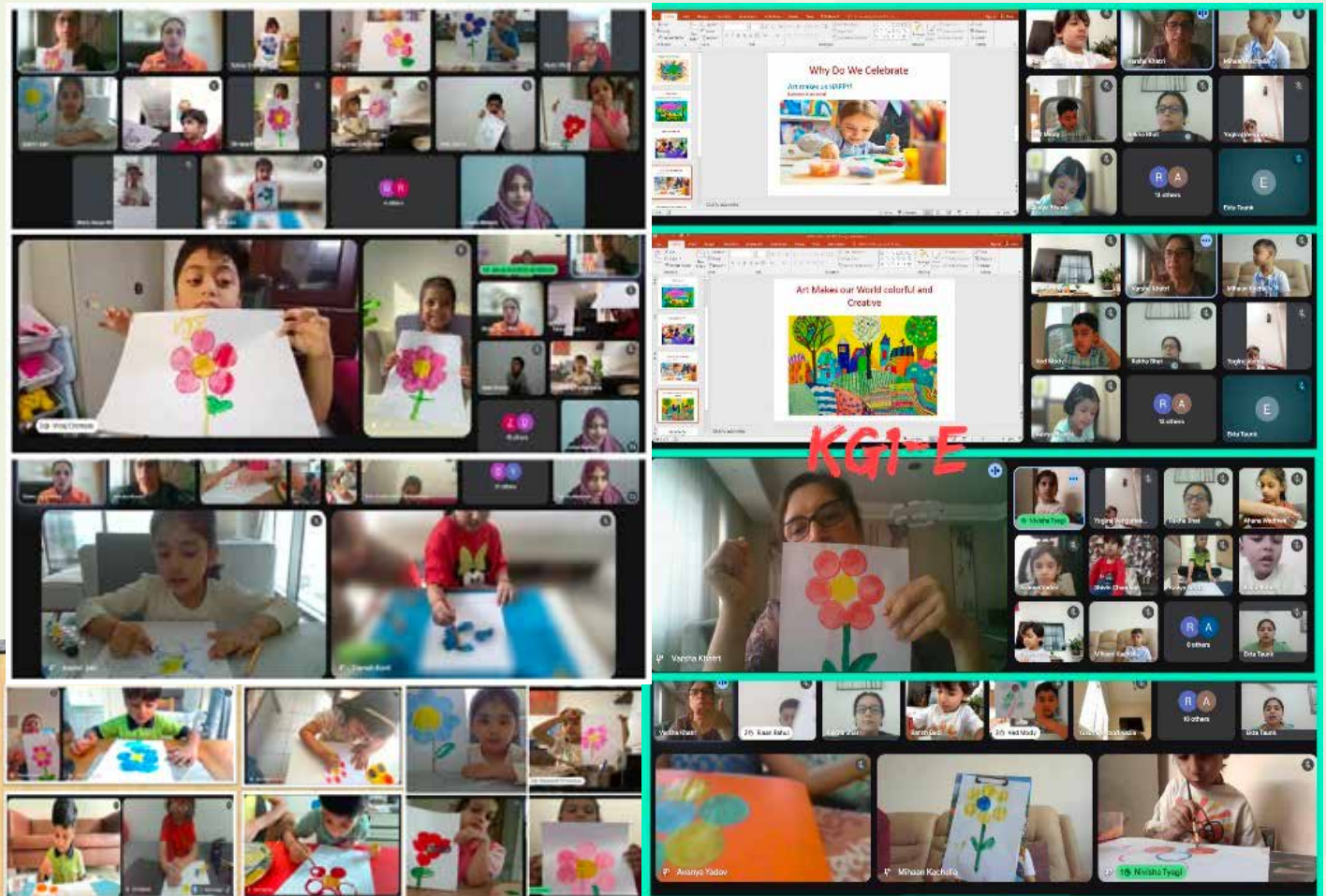

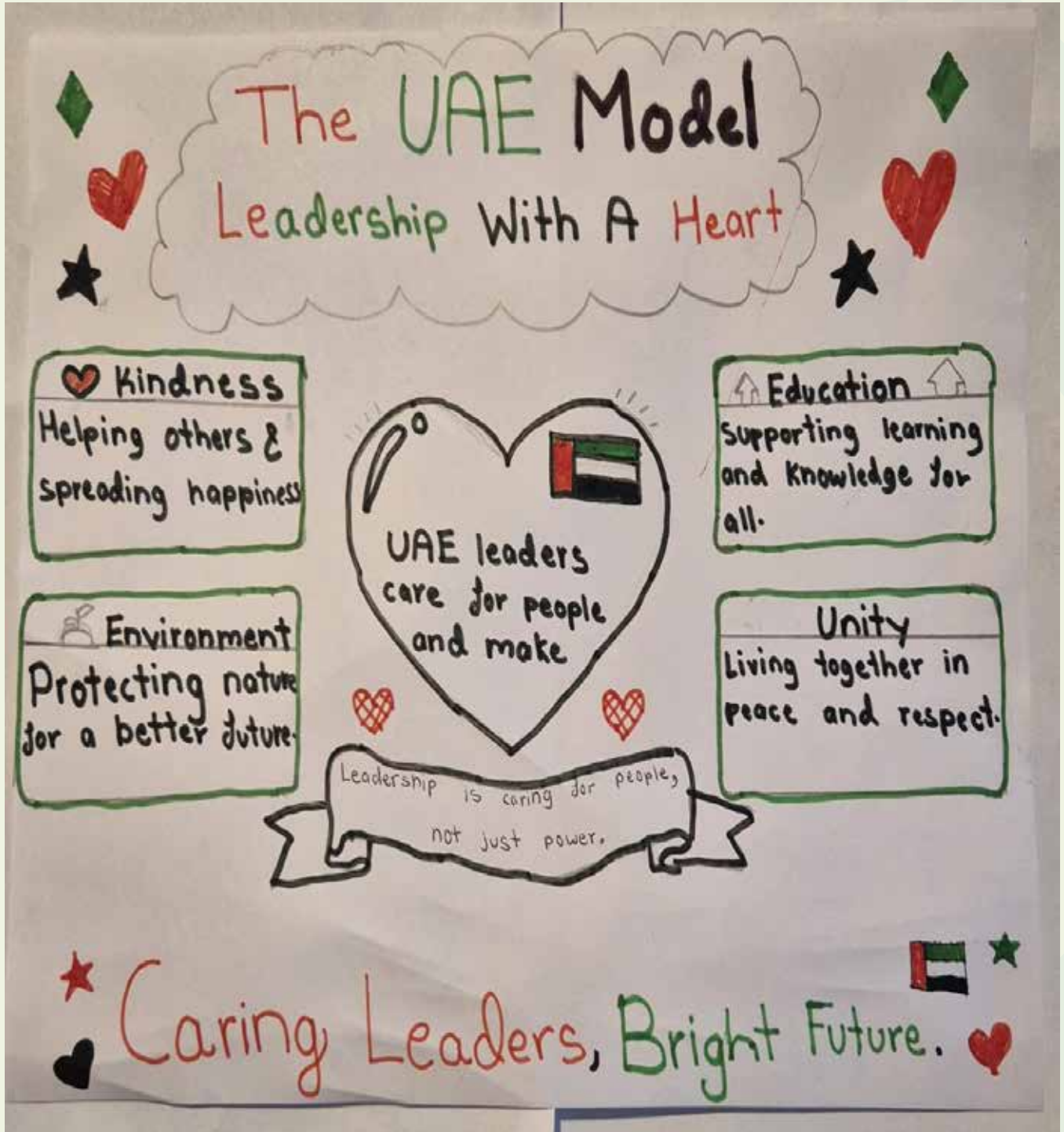

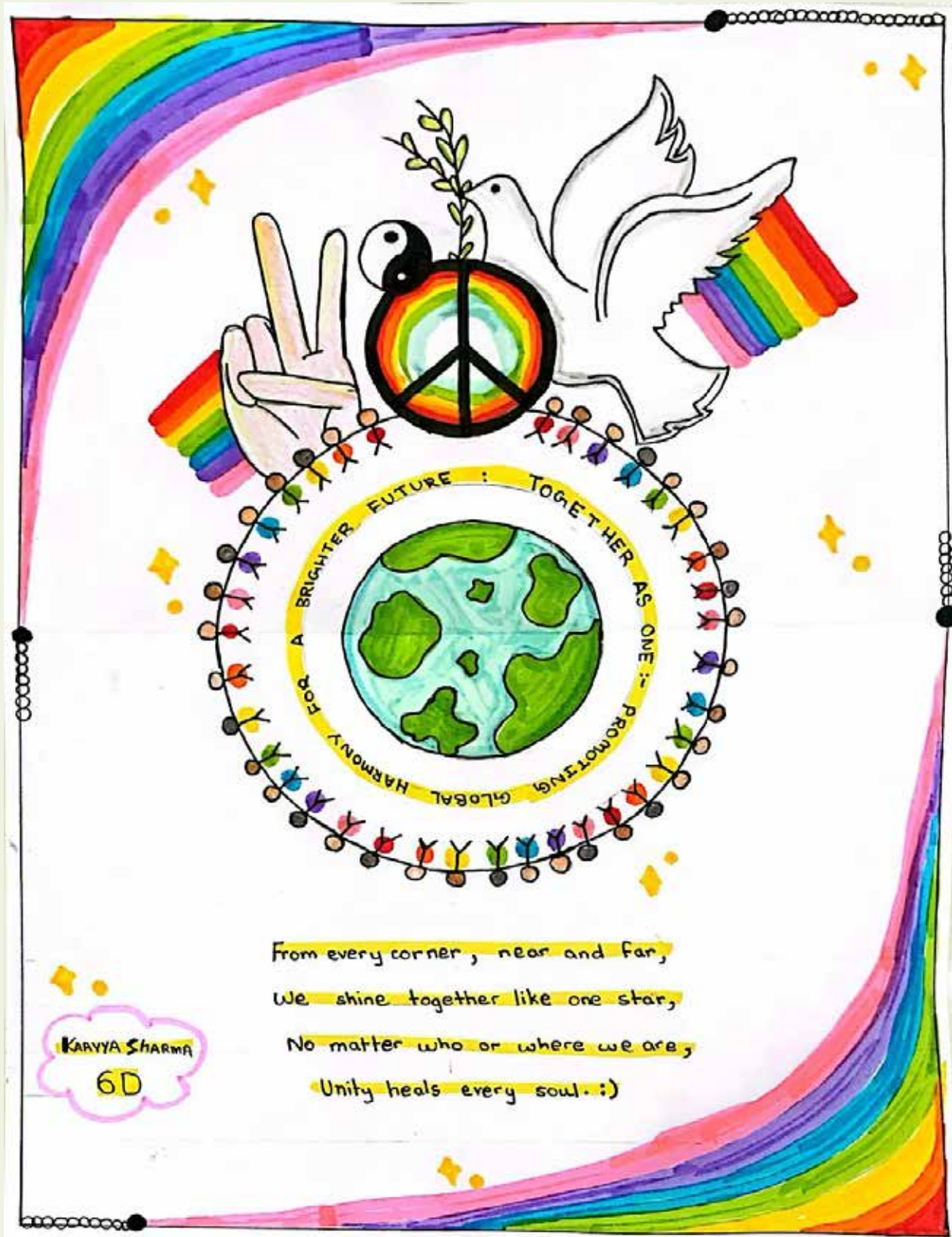

Volunteer: Offer services at Elderly homes, Homeless shelters, or animal rescues.

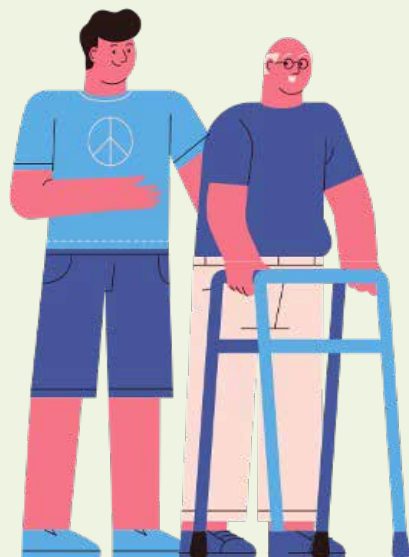
Support Local Businesses: Participate in park cleanups and shop at local businesses

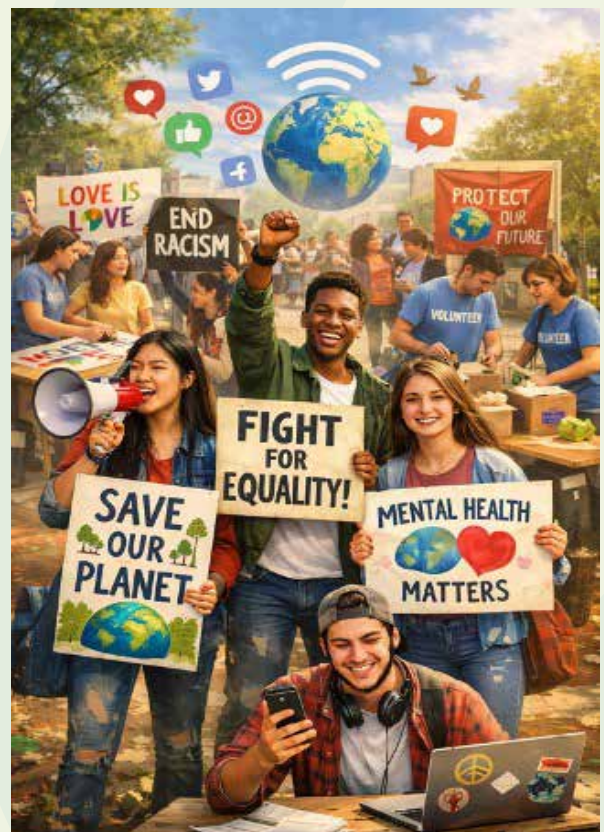

This shows that leadership with a heart is not just about authority, but about making choices that benefit everyone and create a better future.

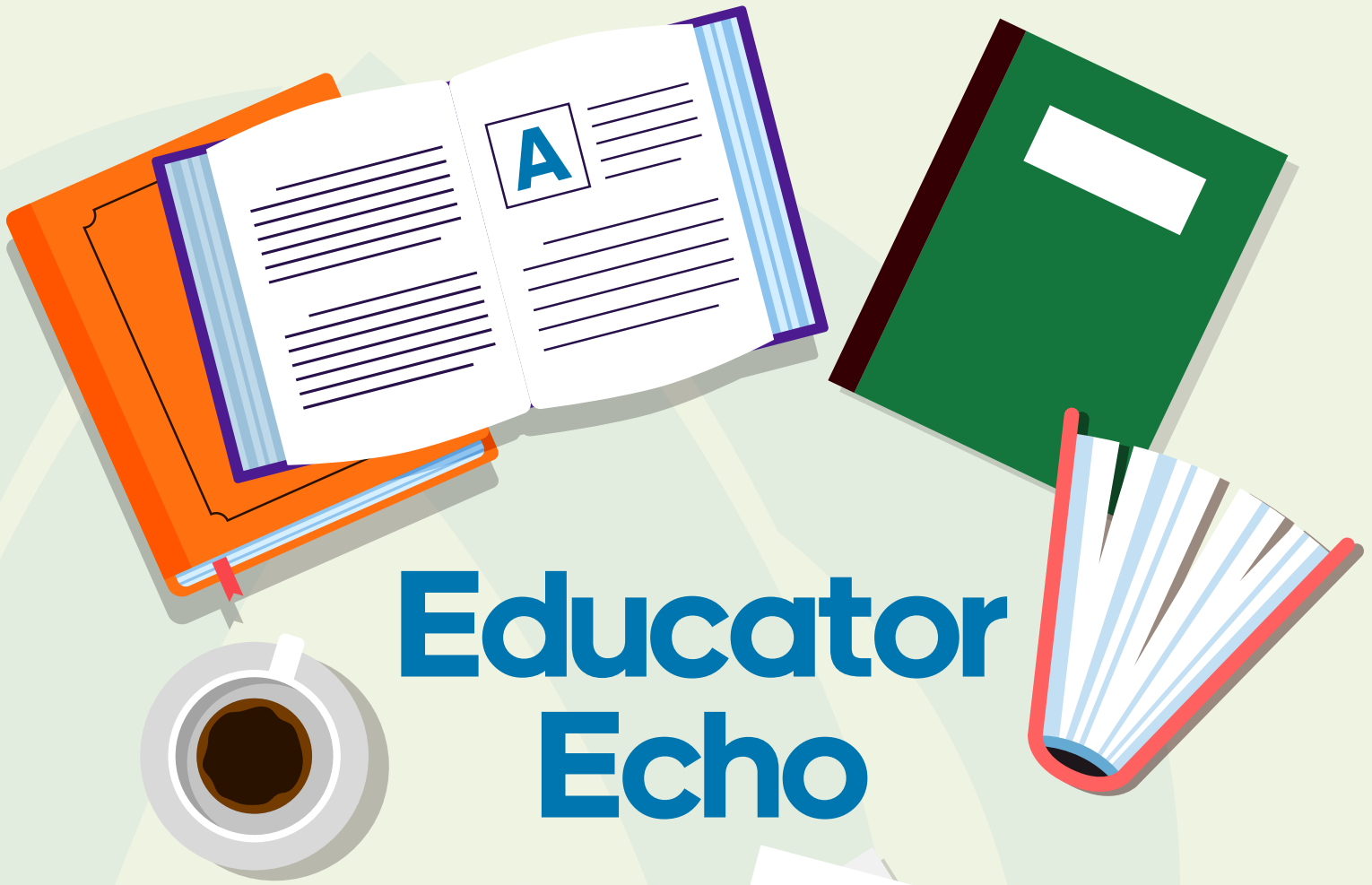

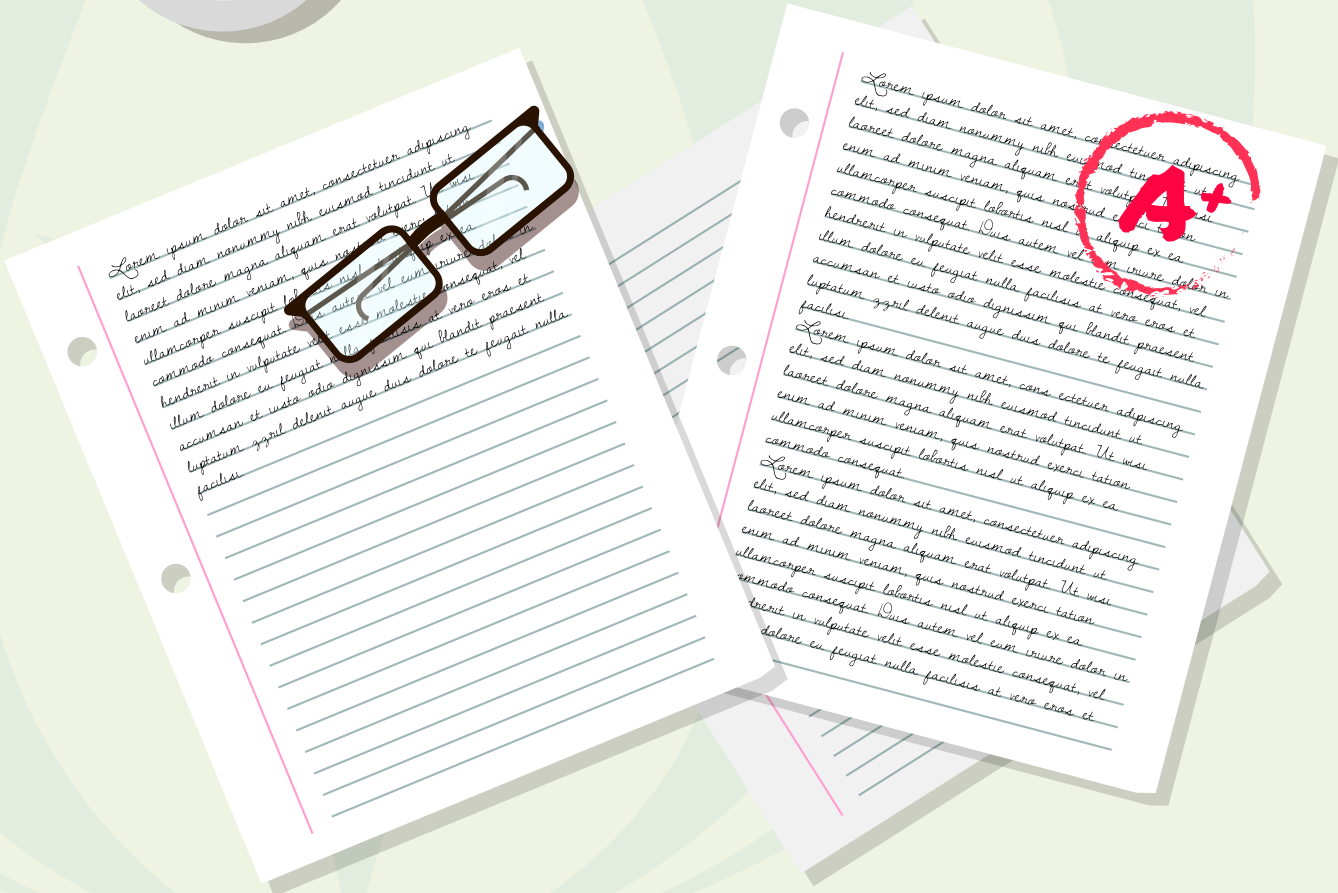

THE TEACHER TALKS

"Be a Cyber Hero! Staying Safe in the Online World"

Year 2008, Swat Valley, Pakistan: An eleven-year-old girl climbed onto a stage at her local press club and delivered a speech that would quietly shake the world. Its title was bold, its author even bolder: "How dare the Taliban take away my basic right to education?" Her name was Malala Yousafzai – and she was still in primary school.

Malala did not wait to grow up before deciding that injustice was worth fighting. Four years later, a gunman shot Malala Yousafzai on her school bus for daring to speak. She survived. And she did not stop.

At seventeen, she became the youngest Nobel peace prize laureate in history – proof that a student's voice, used with courage, can move the world.

Malala's story feels almost too extraordinary to be real – yet time and again literature has been telling us versions of this courage. I want to introduce you to three characters from literature around the world which resonate with the youthful vibrance that you students have – Amir from Khaled Hosseini's famous novel 'The Kite Runner', Mariam from 'A Thousand Splendid Suns', and Santiago from Paulo Coelho's 'The Alchemist'.

The boy Amir from 'The Kite Runner' who transforms from a selfish, guilt ridden child to a selfless courageous adult – choosing conscience over comfort. He shows us that change begins the moment we stop burying what we know to be right.

In 'A Thousand Splendid Suns', Mariam never holds a title or stands on a stage, yet her quiet sacrifice for Laila redefines leadership entirely. She teaches us that compassion shown in private, for someone the world has overlooked, is among the most powerful forces on earth.

Paulo Coelho frames it differently in 'The Alchemist'. Santiago abandons everything familiar to follow his personal legend – discovering that purpose pursued with conviction is itself the greatest gift you can give back to the world: 'When you want something, all the universe conspires in helping you to achieve it.'

A word to this generation or the so called Gen Zs :

Somewhere in the world, a student is organising a climate strike or campaigning for girls' education. Somewhere much closer to home, another student is on hour five of scrolling through trending reels and viral challenges. Both of those students are you. The question is simply which one you choose to be today!

Social change does not begin in parliaments – it begins at home.

Tonight, put down your phone and serve dinner for your parents. Pick up the phone and call your grandparents – the ones who held you before you could walk, who whispered your name in those diaper days when you barely knew your own worth. These are not small gestures. A generation that cannot show compassion at the dinner table will struggle to show it to the world. But one that learns to love well at home?

That generation can change anything!

Be Malala – speak when silence is easier. Be Mariam – love fiercely when no one is watching. Be Santiago – trust that your purpose is a gift to the world. Remember that single moment of choosing presence over a screen – that is where every revolution worth having has always begun!

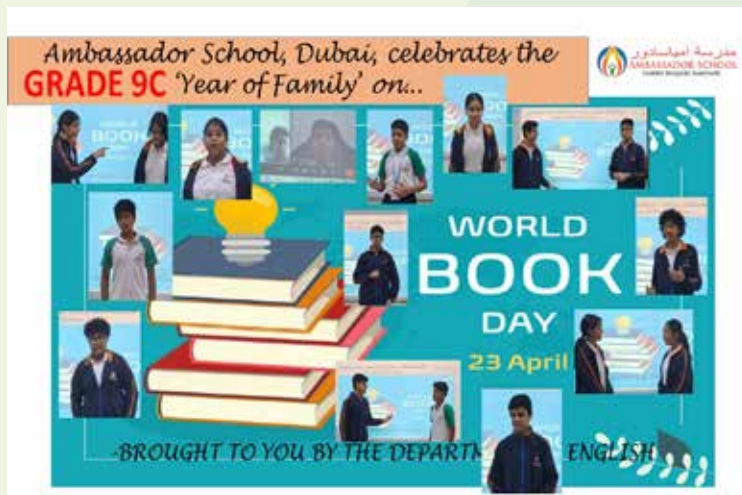

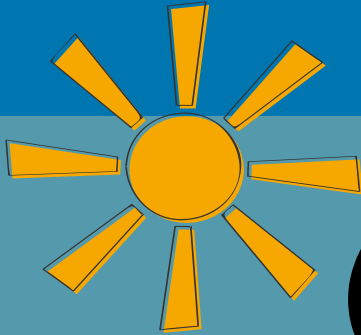
